Netscape 7.2 is the most popular version of the Netscape Browser. Netscape browsers are now open source and have typically been the second most popular browsers to Internet Explorer, but have in many locations it has been replaced by Firefox. This browser includes a pop-up blocker and tabbed browsing which are both enabled by default. Users should take time when installing this browser as it comes with a lot of additional software, which may not be wanted by the user.

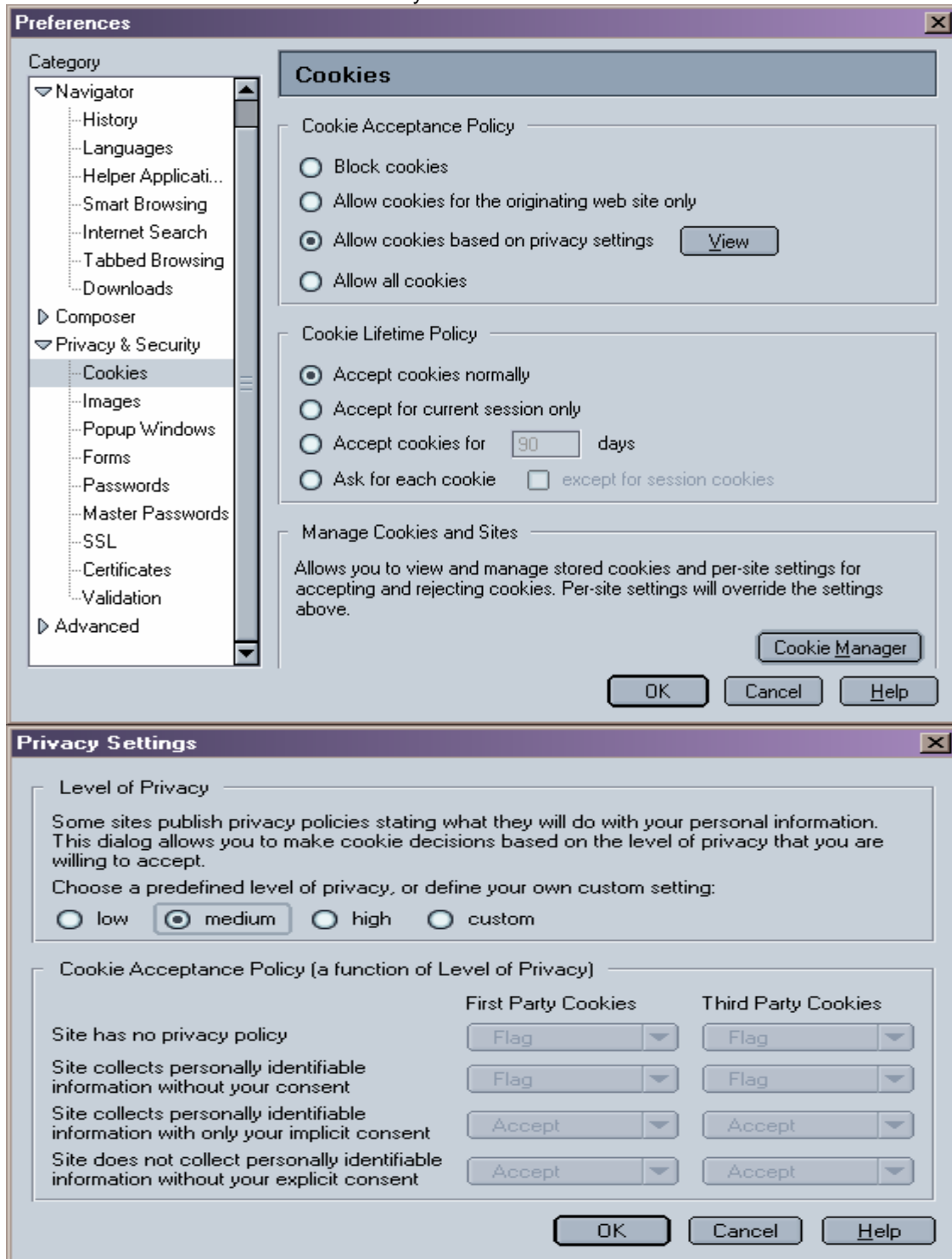

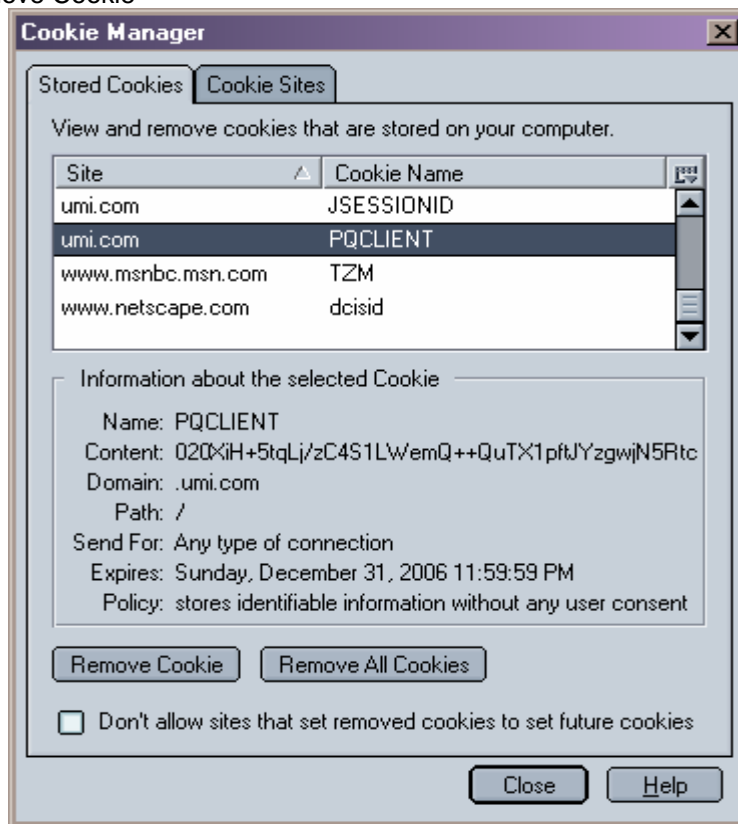
Proper Settings

Enabling / Clearing Cookies

1. Go to Edit -> Preferences
2. Select Privacy & Security -> Cookies from the left column.
3. Make sure settings are set at "Allow cookies based on privacy settings" and "Accept cookies normally".
4. Click on View and make sure the Level of Privacy is set at "medium".

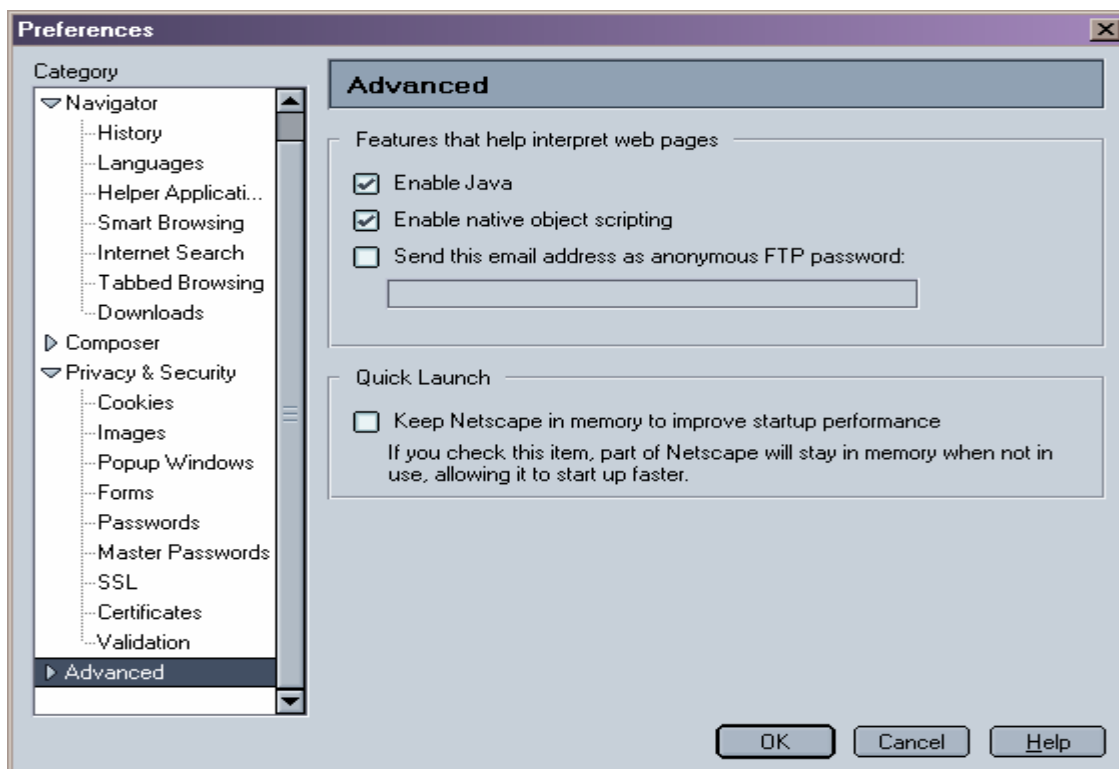


5. To clear cookies, Click on “Cookie Manager” and then select “Remove all cookies” or manually select a cookie from the list and then click “Remove Cookie”
